The Bill Sutton Legacy Scholarship

History

The Bill Sutton Legacy Scholarship was founded in 2010 by the board of the Eastern North Carolina Turfgrass Association to honor a founder of the association. Bill Sutton was also a recipient of the Carolinas GCSA Distinguished Service Award and a founder of the Turfgrass Council of North Carolina. His enthusiasm for people and integrity were legendary. He was a former golf course superintendent at Seymour Johnson Air Force Base and then at Walnut Creek Country Club. As a salesman at Eastern Turf Equipment, Bill helped countless people in the turfgrass industry. Bill Sutton also served his country in the United States Navy during World War II. Perhaps what best sums up Bill Sutton are his “Things Worth Remembering” which read Things Worth Remembering- The value of time, The pleasure of working, The worth of character, The power of kindness, The influence of example, The obligation of duty, The virtue of patience.

General

The Bill Sutton Legacy Scholarship offers education aid to the children and grandchildren of Eastern North Carolina Turfgrass Association members. An award of \$1500 will be given annually. Applications will be reviewed by a committee made up of two anonymous ENCTA board members. All decisions of the committee will be final. Applicants will be notified of their status by mail by June 15 of the year submitted. All scholarship award checks will be made payable to the applicant and his/her educational institution.

Eligibility

1. One or more of the applicant’s parents or grandparents must have been an ENCTA member for five or more consecutive years. The scholarship is open to natural or adoptive offspring of ENCTA members. Children or grandchildren of deceased members are also eligible if the member was active at the time of his or her death.
2. The student must be enrolled full-time at an accredited institution of higher learning, or in the case of high school seniors, must be accepted at such an institution for the next academic year. Graduating seniors must attach a letter of acceptance to their application.

3. Past winners are ineligible to apply the following year. They may reapply after a one-year hiatus.

Criteria for Selection

1. Applicants will be evaluated based on academic achievement, extracurricular and community involvement, leadership, and outside employment.
2. The student must submit an application including a discussion of no more than 250 words on a topic question that will change each year. **The answer to the topic question must be original and not previously submitted with any other scholarship application.**
3. Financial need is not a factor in the selection.

How to apply

Students must complete and submit the attached application form and supply the following under one cover:

1. Transcripts from all high schools and colleges attended
2. Typed original answer to topic question.
3. Graduating high school seniors must attach a collegiate letter of acceptance to their application
4. All applications must be postmarked by April 1 of the year submitted
